Legends of Saint John: Archdeacon H. A. Cody

As I remember Archdeacon H. A. Cody as a child growing up in the South End of Saint John, he was our clergyman at St. James Anglican Church, Broad St. from 1910 – 1941. In his farewell message, as editor of the *Church Bell* which he began in 1910 for our parish, he stated that the contents will be a history in the years to come. “A lot of work but a work of love.”

He was noted as an internationally acclaimed author and his books were among the top sellers in Canada (telling about the Indian camps in the Yukon and the many facts of the Lower St. John River and the Port of Saint John.) He attended the Saint John Grammar School for Boys in 1891, a forerunner of Saint John High.
