My dear Cody:-

I enclose cheque for \$250 in payment of your stipend to 31st inst.

You will be interested in hearing that I am just about to leave for England upon a mission of considerable importance. The main object of the trip is to interview the Secretary of State for the Colonies with a view to securing some satisfactory adjustment of the claims of the Indians of British Columbia. These Indians have for 40 years been treated in some respects most unjustly by the Government of British Columbia. Matters have recently reached a sort of crisis and the Indians are keenly alive to what they consider their rights, namely, that they have a title to the land throughout almost the whole Province, which has not yet been extinguished by Treaty. I am undertaking this mission at the request and at the expense of the Indians themselves.

I hope to return to Canada in time to attend next month's meeting of the Board of M.S.C.C. and very soon after that date to complete my work at Ottawa.

Trusting that you are all well in spite of the severe winter you have had, and with kind regards to Mrs. Cody and every good wish.
